November 18 Program with composer John S. Dixon

Plan on attending our Saturday, November 18, program, and meet composer **John S. Dixon** of Virginia Beach. We will gather at 9:30 am for breakfast treats at Crestwood Christian Church, 1882 Bellefonte Drive, followed by the composer's workshop at 10:00.

John S. Dixon was born in London, England, and was classically trained in piano and organ. He has earned degrees from The Queen's College, Oxford University, and from the Harvard Business School. His composing has flourished since moving to the U.S. in 1988, with hundreds of church and secular pieces to his credit. John successfully completed his CAGO exam in 2016.

One of John's goals is to perform his compositions in all fifty states. He will be presenting for us a program of his own compositions, along with the stories behind how they were created. John's music will be on display for purchase, and he will have pieces to give away. No one will go home empty-handed!

I believe this to be a first-of-its-kind workshop experience for the Lexington AGO, so be sure not to miss it! After the workshop, plan on joining John and other AGO Friends for lunch.
