Spindletop Organ Tour

Michael Rintamaa and I recently had the pleasure of taking a brief trip out to Spindletop Hall and did a small "Organ Crawl." Spindletop is a mansion originally built in the 1930's by the prominent Yount family, and is now owned by the University of Kentucky. In the mansion there is a 1937 Kimball Residence organ. It was designed to be played either from the Four-Manual Console, or by a roll player, similar to that of a player piano. The organ is in desperate need of restorative work and they are taking donations to have work done. It was designated by the OHS as an organ worthy of preservation. We were showed around by a chef at the hall named **Timothy**, who was very knowledgeable of the instrument. He said if anyone was interested in seeing the organ he would be happy to show them around. It was very interesting to me, and I would say between the organ, and the grandeur of the mansion, it is definitely worth a visit.




