
### **Harstad Fine Arts Series**

Be sure to join us on Friday, March 2, at 7:30 p.m., as the Lexington AGO joins with the Harstad Fine Arts Series to present **Mark Mummert**, organist, in a program entitled "Bach at 1718". The program will be held at Faith Lutheran Church, 1000 Tates Creek Road.

Mark Mummert will lead us in a performance/lecture of J. S. Bach's time in Kothen, 300 years ago, his last post before his appointment in Leipzig where Bach would emerge as a mature master of music. Mummert serves as Cantor of Trinity Lutheran Church in Worcester, MA. He was the 2015 Distinguished Visiting Cantor at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Gettysburg. He served as Director of Worship at Christ the King Lutheran Church, Houston (2008-2015) and Seminary Musician at the Lutheran Theological Seminary at Philadelphia (1990-2008). His numerous compositions and essays are published by Augsburg Fortress.






