

KY Convener Update

Congratulations to **Larry Sharp**, who has been named the Kentucky State Convener! He will work closely with the other State Conveners in the Great Lakes Region and the Great Lakes Regional Councillor, Karl Bruhn.

We'd also like to thank Larry for his generous donation for our program year magnets, which you should be receiving in the mail in the near future. Thanks Larry!

On Sunday, October 7, at 7:00pm, our chapter will be doing something that it has never done before – we will be co-hosting a very special program with the BGTOS (Bluegrass Theatre Organ Society)! They are very excited about this, and so are many members of the AGO. They will be bringing John Baratta, theatre organist, to give a recital, lead a sing-along, and accompany a silent movie, "College". This is a ticketed event (\$20 per ticket) in order to raise money for the restoration of the 1926 Wurlitzer theatre pipe organ that was originally in the Kentucky Theater. The following has been submitted by **Bill Webber**, who has been instrumental in making sure this program goes smoothly –

"College" is a 1927 comedy-drama silent film directed by James W. Horne and Buster Keaton, and starring Keaton, Anne Cornwall, and Harold Goodwin. Prior to the silent movie the concert will feature a singalong. We will have the words for the songs projected onto the movie screen to make it easy for everyone in the audience to sing along with the organ music.

John V. Baratta is a native of Lodi, New Jersey and presently resides in Wantage, New Jersey. John attended Jersey City State College where he studied piano and organ, graduating with a Bachelor of Arts degree in music education. He has recently retired from teaching music in the public school system for thirty years. John is the resident organist and director of music for the Grace Evangelical Lutheran Church in River Edge, New Jersey. He is also the house organist for the historic Newton Theater located in Newton, New Jersey.

Mr. Baratta is a member of the Hudson Valley and Northern New Jersey chapters of The American Guild of Organists, and is a longtime member of The New York Theatre Organ Society.


