Grant Holcomb, one of our Young Organist members, was able to have an exciting summer as the Music Intern and Assistant at Montreat Conference Center, and he has submitted an article telling about his time there. This was a great opportunity for him. Congratulations to Grant!

Summer Fun

I am privileged to have spent this summer (May 26-August 4) living and working in North Carolina at Montreat Conference Center, as the full-time Summer Music Intern/Assistant. For those of you who aren't familiar, Montreat is a Presbyterian-affiliated conference center just outside of Asheville, NC. Over the summer, the Conference Center hosts numerous conferences, one of which is the Presbyterian Association of Musicians "Worship and Music" conferences, which were especially inspiring (during which I also saw lots of familiar faces). Each conference concludes with a high-caliber Sunday morning worship service. These services are enriched with esteemed preachers that the conference center brings in from all over the country.

The organ at Montreat is a large 3-manual digital organ built by the Walker Technical Company. It has Aeolian-Skinner digitally reproduced sounds. There are speakers on either end of the room and the entire organ can be played from the front, rear, or both sets of speakers at any given time. It also has a floating solo division that can be played from any of the manuals or pedal.

The position I hold at Montreat is a new position that is only in its second year. My supervisor, Eric Wall, is the Conference Center Musician. Many of you may remember Eric, as he did a hymn festival and AGO workshop in Lexington a handful of years ago. Eric, for many years, was the musician at First Presbyterian Church in Asheville, NC, but has recently relocated to teach at the Austin Presbyterian Theological Seminary in Texas.

Though I shadow Eric in most every aspect of his work here at Montreat, a large part of my experience is studying organ and conducting. We share a pretty even split of service playing and conducting duties for the Sunday services. We work through organ repertoire, choral accompaniments at the organ, choral conducting, and intensely study hymn-playing. One of Eric's main areas of research and expertise is invigorating congregational singing through creative hymn-playing. He is well-known for his work with hymn festivals.

During PAM's "Worship and Music" conferences, I served as the musician for their morning prayer services. Counting both Sunday services and the morning prayer services, I played a total of 13 services in 14 days! I had the privilege of splitting a concert program on July 6th with Eric Wall and Abby Temple (Undergraduate Trumpet Performance major at the University of Kentucky, but calls Hickory, NC home!). I also had the privilege of attending a hymn festival presented by John Ferguson (retired Professor of Organ and Church Music at St. Olaf College), while he was in town for Lutheridge's (a similar conference center, though Lutheran-affiliated) music week. The hymn festival was at First Presbyterian, Asheville, where John played the stunning 2014, 59 rank, Holtkamp pipe organ.

It has been a wonderful experience here, and I look forward to seeing everyone in Lexington!


