Happy September! I hope you're enjoying getting back into the swing of things now that summer is nearing its end. It's almost time to start digging out the Christmas music from the basement!





Summer Fun

It was my privilege to attend again this summer's Annual Conference of the Association of Disciple Musicians, July 7-12. This year's conference was held at Webster Groves Christian Church, Webster Forest United Methodist Church and Kirkwood Presbyterian Church in St. Louis, MO. World class clinicians included Dr. Ron and Linda Allen from Christian Theological Seminary in Indianapolis – Worship; Dr. Mack Wilberg, Director of the Tabernacle Choir in Salt Lake City – ADM Chorus and Choral Workshops; Andra Moran, Nashville Song Writer, Recording Artist, and Contemporary Worship Designer; Dr. Janette Fishell of Indiana University – Organ; and Joel Raney, Composer and Music Editor-Publisher – Handbells.

Having served various times since 1980 on the ADM Planning Council and as President and Treasurer twice, it was kind of fun to serve this year as Recording Secretary (now I can say I've held all the offices for better or worse). But the greatest joy of all was to be the planning council liaison this past year and during the conference week for Dr. Mack Wilberg (his constant "shadow" and "go-for). He is one of the most kind, caring, down-toearth and consummate professionals one will ever meet. I so enjoyed as always not only the workshops, concerts, worship, etc., but the simple "table talk" with these outstanding clinicians and leaders.

I also had the privilege again to be a presenter teaching a workshop on Worship Planning for the Service of Word and Table for Clergy and Musicians Jointly. We spent the two-day session exploring the use of the historic Sunday service of Word and Table, not only for more "traditional" worship settings, but also for the various "emerging" worship experiences.

Next year's conference titled: "Will You Come and Follow Me" will be held on July 26-31 in Tulsa, Oklahoma at the University of Tulsa. The clinician head-liners will be: Dr. Anton Armstrong- Choral; Tom Trenney – Organ; The Forte Handbells – Handbell; and Dr. Marcia McFee – Worship Design. The conference preacher will be the Rev. 


