Our March Program was a two-day event, featuring LexAGO's good friend, Dr. Paul Barte, from Ohio University. Friday evening, March 6, Paul gave a concert in costume as J. S. Bach, where he presented an all-Bach program and discussed each piece, as perhaps Bach himself would have introduced the pieces. With many in attendance from both the chapter and the community, this was a great way to celebrate Bach's birthday month. The very Baroque color of the organ at Maxwell Street Presbyterian Church added a nice touch to the program as well.

Saturday's masterclass was also Baroque themed, although Dr. Barte was not in costume for this session! Mark DeAlba presented *Praeludium in g minor, BuxWV 149*, by Buxtehude, and James Humlong played *Ich ruf' zu dir, Herr Jesu Christ, BWV* 639, by J. S. Bach. Dr. Barte was very helpful in explaining Baroque technique, ornamentation, registration, and the history behind these pieces. It was a very informative session and an enjoyable weekend.






