75TH ANNIVERSARY KICKOFF PICNIC – SEPTEMBER 26

To begin our year-long celebration of Lexington AGO's 75th anniversary, we will have a picnic at noon on Saturday, Sept. 26th on the grounds of Walnut Hill **Church**, 575 Walnut Hill Rd. in Lexington. This will be a bring-your-own food, drink, mask and chair event, and social distancing will be observed. The first meeting of the AGO's Lexington Chapter was held on Sunday afternoon, February 25, 1945, at Central Christian Church. World War II was still raging. In fact, on that particular day, Allied forces captured the wealthy city of Düren, Germany.

Our chapter began with fifteen members. Officers elected at that inaugural meeting were Mrs. Lela W. Cullis, dean; Mrs. Earl T. Bryant, sub dean; Perry G. Parrigin, secretary; Mr. B. A. Cheek, treasurer; and Mrs. Eleanor Brogle Knox, auditor. At the second meeting on April 8, the treasurer reported that the treasury had a balance of \$29.75. By June, the balance had dropped to \$22.50. Discussions at early meetings focused on wedding fees (no decision), as well as the "problems pertaining to organists and to choir directors." Seventy-five years later, we're still discussing those issues!

Significantly, the first chapter dinner was held at the Lafayette Hotel on May 8. That was V-E Day; therefore, much of Europe and North America were ecstatically celebrating victory. Curiously, no mention of the celebration was mentioned in the minutes, but the ongoing perennial problem of wedding fees was duly noted by the chapter secretary.




