#### OCTOBER VIDEO EVENT: "Behold the Theatre Organ!"

As you've already heard, our in-person October event "Behold the Theatre Organ!" that was to be held at the Kentucky Theatre has been canceled due to the pandemic and temporary closure of the theatre. In its place a video is being created by Lynn Vera. The video will feature local, national and international theatre organists and will cover the same topics that would have been presented at the live event, with the added bonus of being able to watch and learn in the comfort of your favorite chair! As of this writing the video is not yet complete, but we expect to release it during the week of October 18<sup>th</sup>. #### NOVEMBER PROGRAM EVENT: Jillian Gardner to present Recital on November 6<sup>TH</sup>

Jillian Gardner will present a recital for our members on Friday, November 6<sup>th</sup> at 7:30 pm on the Randall Dyer organ at Cathedral of Christ the King in Lexington. Jillian is an award-winning performing organist with an international touring schedule. She is also the AGO National Councillor for Young Organists as well as the Director of Music at First United Methodist Church in Huntsville, AL. A graduate of the Oberlin Conservatory and Baylor University, she has performed concerts in venues including Fourth Presbyterian Church, Chicago; St. Mary's Cathedral, San Francisco; St. Thomas 5th Avenue, New York City; St. Paul's Cathedral in London, and has been a featured artist for OHS and AGO Conventions. This will be Jillian's first trip to Lexington! Her program will include works by Bach, Vierne, Tchaikovsky, and Elgar among others. Covid-19 protocol will be observed, so audience members will be socially distanced and masks will be required. At this time we are also investigating the possibility of live-streaming Jillian's concert for members who are unable to attend in person. If we are able to work this out, an email with details will be sent to the membership a few days prior to the recital.

#### by Dr. Ted Gentry, Lexington AGO Chapter Historian

Starting with a small group of 15 members in 1945, the Lexington Chapter had a remarkably busy calendar during the early years. Meetings and programs were scheduled nearly every month from September through May. The early winter dinner meeting at the Lafayette Hotel quickly became established as an annual event.

In the late 1940s, monthly chapter meetings included celebrity organists of the day. Finances were extremely tight in those years. The last reported treasury balance of the decade was only \$18.15. Therefore, like we do now, the chapter often "piggy-backed" on other institutions and churches for programming. On October 13, 1946, the regular meeting was at UK's Memorial Hall for a recital by Marcel Dupré. The recording secretary, Myrtle V. Kesheimer, noted that the hall was so packed that she was unable to find a seat. In March, 1948, she wrote that E. Power Biggs played a "thrilling recital" in Hughes Auditorium at Asbury College. The chapter hosted a reception for him after the program. Even lesser known organists drew crowds in those days. For example, Oswald Regatz, organ instructor at Indiana University, played a recital at the Presbyterian Church (no mention of which, presumably First?) in February 1949. In discussing preparations for the recital at the chapter's January meeting, the membership decided to print 500 programs for the event. This was an era when organ music was considered to be an integral part of musical life in central Kentucky.






