Gwen T. Frazier, MM, CAGO

Before returning to Lexington in mid-Sept. 2020, Gwen previously held dual AGO memberships in the Northern VA and Lexington chapters, having resided in Northern VA since late 1986. She holds Bachelor/Master degrees in Organ Performance from UK (studied with Schuyler Robinson and Arnold Blackburn) with postgraduate work and has earned the AGO Service Playing/Colleague certificates.



Gwen most recently served as Organist of Cherrydale United Methodist in Arlington, VA from 2009-2020 and prior to that position served as Music Director/Organist of St. Luke's UMC in DC (now joined with Metropolitan Methodist, DC), and Trinity Episcopal Church, Manassas, VA and as Interim Organist in several parishes including Pohick Episcopal Church, Emmanuel Lutheran (VA) and Capitol Hill Presbyterian, DC. She has also taught private organ and organ and is also retired from Federal Contracting work. Since retiring from this full-time position, Gwen had returned to teaching private piano and organ teaching and has additionally accompanied vocal students in private studios (VA) and at Northern VA Community College campus (Alexandria, VA). She is also a member of the Organ Historical Society, Hymn Society and the ALCM (Lutheran Musicians). Gwen also previously served at Music Director/Organist at St. Raphael's Episcopal Church in Lexington from 1980-86 prior to moving to VA.

Gwen and her husband Don now reside in Versailles and are delighted to return to horse country, friends and colleagues in the Lexington chapter, and Gwen's home state. Don is also a church musician (pianist/organist), having served several Northern VA Lutheran and Methodist congregations and was a previous active member of the Northern VA and Greater Kansas City AGO Chapters.

In 1960, the Lexington Chapter celebrated the installation of several new organs in area churches: Central Christian (Holtkamp), Church of the Ascension in Frankfort (Austin), Meadowthorpe Presbyterian (Charles Wood), and Woodland Christian (Reuter). Betsy Steiner played the dedication recital at Woodland Christian in a diverse program on October 11, ranging from Bach's Toccata and Fugue in d minor to Dupré's Variations on a Noel. A month later, the new Holtkamp at Central Christian was dedicated with a recital presented by Robert Baker, organist at Fifth Presbyterian and Temple Emmanuel in New York City. His three-part program began with Handel's first organ concerto and concluded with Jongen's Toccata in D-flat.

In 1961, the AGO doubled annual membership dues from \$5 to \$10, a decision that generated much discussion at chapter meetings. Several opinions were expressed on how to spend the "windfall" that the chapter would receive since half of the dues would be earmarked for Lexington. Some felt that the five dollars per member would enable the chapter to host guest organists for recitals. Others asserted that the chapter should refund part of the dues to members as a rebate. This last idea was studied by a committee, but it was never implemented. Also in 1961, the chapter once again began investigating the possibility of hosting a regional convention.

At the meeting on September 12, 1961, a new member was introduced to the chapter. Marian Soule, organist at the Christian Science church, was warmly welcomed. Sixty years later, Marian is still an active and highly respected member of our chapter. For 37 years she served faithfully as organist at Southern Hills United Methodist Church.

The Pipe Organ Encounter+ (PLUS)

- Is a 4-5 day event organized by a local AGO chapter under the sponsorship of the national organization.
- Is a national program sponsored by the American Guild of Organists. Participants are admitted to POE+s on a first-come, first-served basis, regardless of attendance at prior POEs, and regardless of state or country of residence, as long as they meet the following eligibility guidelines: Participants should be 19 or older, want to play the organ or currently play the organ in a church or synagogue, and be interested in improving their organ skills.
- Is open to organists ranging from beginners (proficient pianists who will learn the basics of organ playing) to advanced.
- Offers instruction in basic technique, pedaling, improvisation and registration for beginners, and skills such as hymn playing, sight reading and transposition (which may lead to qualifying as a candidate for the AGO Service Playing Certificate) for more experienced participants. Other topics include a general overview of organ literature, history, and pipe organ construction and design.
- Provides an opportunity for participation in ecumenical worship, so as to experience the role of the sacred musician.
- Most of all, provides a unique opportunity for participants to meet and interact with peers who have similar interests.


