MICHAEL MESSINA CONCERT—OCTOBER 8TH

You are invited to a multimedia presentation of The Birth of the Lord as told in visual art, organ music and scripture, featuring organist, conductor, and scholar Michael Messina. The hour-long program hinges on nine meditations: The Virgin and Child, The Shepherds, Eternal Purposes, The Word, The Children of God, The Angels, Jesus accepts Suffering, The Wise Men, and God Among Us. Each meditation is based on a Biblical excerpt, a distinct piece of organ music, and several of the 177 accompanying images.

The organ music, *La Nativité du Seigneur* (The Birth of the Lord), comes to us from the French organist and composer Olivier Messiaen (1908-1992). A devout Catholic, Messiaen sought to illuminate the tenets of his faith and the beauty of nature through music. Combined with his distinct



method of composition and organ improvisation, he contributed more to the organ and its repertoire than anyone since the death of Johann Sebastian Bach in 1750 (Messina).

Images will be projected in coordination with the music. They were chosen by Holly Day, curator emerita of Contemporary Art at Indianapolis Museum of Art at Newfields, and consist of high-resolution captures of paintings from the Indianapolis Museum of Art, the Rijksmuseum in Amsterdam, the Art Institute of Chicago, and the Louvre in Paris.

I want to welcome and encourage you to attend this rare artistic offering at Good Shepherd, cosponsored with the Lexington Chapter of the American Guild of Organists.

ORGAN SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE!

Scholarships up to \$500 are available from our chapter through the John Courter Scholarship Fund for those interested in attending a regional or national AGO convention, or a Pipe Organ Encounter (POE). These scholarships are available to our younger members from 18 to early 30's in age. An AGO convention or POE is a wonderful cultural and educational experience for young organists.

In order to be eligible for the scholarship, applicants need to apply at least 3 months prior to the event they wish to attend. Applicants who demonstrate financial need will receive priority consideration, but scholarships will not solely be determined by financial need. All scholarship recipients must be willing to provide a written report and/or oral presentation at a chapter meeting following the convention or POE.

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DIVERTIMENTO

THE BASIC RULES OF ENSEMBLE PLAYING

- 1. All should play the same piece.
- 2. If you hit a wrong note, look at your partners furiously.
- 3. Stop at every repeat sign, and discuss whether or not you should repeat; the audience will like that.
- 4. Take your time when turning pages.
- 5. The right note at the wrong time is a wrong note, and vice versa.
- 6. If everybody else is wrong except yourself, follow those who are wrong.
- 7. The dynamic, grace notes, tempo and legato indications only exist to decorate the score; do not mind them.
- 8. If a passage is difficult, slow down. If it is easy, go faster. At the end, everything will catch up.
- 9. When the others stop playing, do not play your leftover notes.
- 10. Advice from Shakespeare:
 - —a rest is a silence (Hamlet)
 - —my foot my tutor (The Tempest)
 - —my kingdom for a semiquaver (Richard III)
