#### THE JOHN COURTER SCHOLARSHIP FOR YOUNG ORGANISTS

The Lexington Chapter seeks to support and encourage student members of the chapter in furthering their musical knowledge and experience. With this in mind, the Chapter will offer a limited number of scholarships to assist with registration fees for regional or national conventions of the American Guild of Organists and the American Choral Directors Association, as well as Pipe Organ Encounters. The scholarship fund began as a bequest from our late chapter dean, John Courter, FAGO. Its funds are supplemented each year by donations taken at the chapter's Christmas Pipes member recital.

In order to qualify for AGO or ACDA convention assistance, an applicant must be a member of the Lexington Chapter who is enrolled in college and/or taking organ lessons.

To qualify for a POE scholarship, the applicant must be a member of the Lexington Chapter and enrolled and accepted to a POE.

All scholarship recipients must be willing to provide a written report and/or oral presentation at a chapter meeting following the convention or POE.

Scholarships may or may not be renewable. The Chapter reserves the right to decline applications of students who have already received an award for previous conventions. The chapter reserves the right to decline scholarship applications and/or make selection of recipients based on demonstrated financial need.

Awards may not exceed \$500. Funds will be sent directly to the student upon verification of fees submitted and registration confirmation. If a student receives a scholarship, but is unable to attend, the funds received are expected to be returned to the Lexington AGO.

#### **Application Procedure:**

Please complete and submit the application form on the next page at least three months prior to the regional or national convention or POE you wish to attend. Applicants who demonstrate financial need will receive priority consideration, but scholarships will not solely be determined by financial need.






